Please pre-register for this event (see below). We are limited to 100 participants between the ages of 8 and 18. This is an excellent opportunity for your son or daughter (grandkids, too!) to shoot targets with .22 rifle, .30 carbine, black powder hunting rifle (muzzleloader), shotgun, air rifle and more...

All young shooters will be assisted and instructed by River Bend Gun Club volunteers.

This event is open to members and non-members alike. So tell your friends and neighbors..... and don't forget to pre-register for a great time.

How does your Young Shooter participate?

1. Download the [Registration Form](#) and [Liability Waiver](#) (available on the club website), complete both documents and mail to the address on the registration form. Registration is limited to 100 participants so get your forms in early! RBGC members must complete both forms as well.
2. Plan to be at the range by 8am. Safety briefing and instructions will begin at 8:30am. All participants are required to be present for the safety briefing – don't be late!
3. Expect to be at the range until late afternoon. A snack lunch will be provided. Participants will be outside all day, wear appropriate attire, shorts are discouraged for participants.
4. Bring a chair if you like.
5. Bathrooms are available on the range.
6. All firing will be done on the Cowboy range which is the first range on your right as you come onto club property. Plenty of parking is available. A map to River Bend Gun Club is
