River Bend Gun Club Scholarship Program

The Holidays are here and the deadline for submitting applications for the 2023 River Bend Gun Club Scholarships is approaching quickly. The applications for the scholarship are awarded for this upcoming school year beginning Fall 2023. **All applications must be emailed before midnight, December 31, 2022**.

Scholarship applicants can <u>click here to download</u> the application; necessary instructions are included within the application. The current application and criteria documents can also be located on our website under Documents/RBGC Scholarship Program/2023.

Applicants are encouraged to submit their applications as soon as possible. Those who wait until the last minute may not have enough time to correct any deficiencies by the deadline. An Applicant is disqualified for incomplete submittals received by the deadline or not following instructions; in most cases this entails failure to provide two reference letters. Extensions beyond the deadline will not be granted for any reason.

After the application has been accepted, an in-person interview with the Scholarship Committee will be scheduled in the upcoming months. Applicants should prepare for the committee interview the same way they would prepare for an employment interview. Dress the way you want to be perceived; typically, business casual. Take time to study the program and become familiar with the criteria and method of selection; be prepared:

The ideal candidate possesses the aptitudes, demeanor and motivation to successfully enter and complete a university or an accredited professional school program. The ideal scholarship candidate knows and can support the Second Amendment of the Bill of Rights and will represent the shooting sports in a positive manner.

In years past, the Scholarship Committee has awarded scholarships to successful and deserving candidates. They each demonstrated the necessary scholastic aptitudes, instructional comprehension, forethought, preparedness, initiative and advocation of the shooting sports.

The members of the Scholarship Committee are Phil Henderson, Kelly Duncan, Brad Griffin, Will Owensby and Ernie Knoche. We look forward to working with this year's applicants.

Official Club Business

Highlights of the September 12, 2022 Board of Directors Meeting

President Will Owensby presided over a quorum of six Board members. Also attending were the Club Manager, the Assistant Club Manager, four club officers, one life member, two annual members, and one life member spouse. The meeting was convened at 7:00PM on Monday, September 12, 2022. The meeting was held at RBGC's Gene Mowell Conference Center on club property.

A quorum was confirmed, the proposed agenda was adopted, the minutes of the August 22, 2022, Board meeting were approved and the following officer and manager reports were presented and accepted:

Treasurer Secretary Chief Range Officer Club Manager Shotgun Manager

Board decisions made, actions taken, and items of interest:

- Treasurer Geoff Rhines reported that August FYTD income was \$640K, an increase of approximately \$23K versus the same period in FY 2021.
- August FYTD expense was \$196K, an increase of approximately \$43K versus the same period in FY 2021.
- Cash in the bank as of 8/31/22 was \$570,522 including \$100,218 in Capital Reserve Fund.
- Club Secretary Erica D'Amico reported that the membership total at the beginning of the September 2022 meeting was 2,165, 64 members more than this time last year.
- The number of Senior Members at the beginning of the September 2022 meeting was 202 (9.33% of RBGC membership).
- Chief Range Officer Jim Garner reported that the Range Use Summary Report for August 2022 totaled 2,347 (1,912 members and 435 guests).
- Fifteen venues submitted Match Use Summary Reports for August 2022. Total entries were 445 (236 members, 199 non-members, and 10 juniors). August match income was \$4,970.00 with \$1,087.30 reported to the club.
- There was a New Member Orientation (NMO) class held on August 28, 2022, for 24 attendees.
- There were 18 Tac Rifle Certifications, 0 NFA Certifications, 0 Supergun Certifications, and 8 Stop the Bleed Certifications in August.
- The board approved Renee Livingstone as Assistant Range officer for HP Silhouette.
- Club Manager Eric Leid reported that the trees on the left side of the Bullseye parking lot were cleared to establish the new Shotgun patterning bay and the Shotgun patterning board has been moved from CB Bay 11 to Bullseye parking area.
- Overgrowth has been cleared out of the berms separating AP4 & AP5.
- Cast-iron drain covers were put over catch basins across from AP4 & AP5.
- Bullseye Range roof was repaired and bathrooms were repainted with Kilz to prevent mold growth.
- Steel target at the 200m line on the Silhouette Range was repaired.
- MP1 target backers were replaced.
- Return spring on AP1 bowling pin plate rack was replaced.
- Assistant Club Manager Greg Hughes reported that shotgun range use in August 2022 was 383 shooters (351 members and 32 guests). 1,163 rounds were fired during August with 24 cart rentals. Total August revenue to the club was \$8,863.00.
- Member Communications Manager David Norcross reported that the September Bullet-IN reached 2,273 recipients with 2,272 successful deliveries (99.9%). Open rate was 1,599 (70.4%) and 708 (31.2%) members clicked through the newsletter.
- Assistant Club Manager Greg Hughes reported that any members that have not renewed for the 2022-2023 fiscal year have been moved to 'dropped' status and gate access has been terminated. These members may renew by contacting the Club Manager's office.

- Range Committee Chairman Jim Garner reported that the annual range committee meeting is scheduled for 11/6/22 from 1
 -3PM in the Gene Mowell Conference Center.
- Twenty-three women attended the Women on Target training on 9/10/22.
- Brad Griffin and Bill Illg were both nominated for Life Director to replace Life Director Charlie Iracondo who resigned. Bill Illg was approved as Life Director by 4-3 vote.
- Bill Illg was nominated and approved as Life Director for the Executive Committee by unanimous vote.

Regular monthly Board meetings are called to order at 7:00 PM on the second Monday of each month in the Gene Mowell Conference Center. RBGC members and families are cordially invited to attend.

NRA Light Rifle RBGC Club Championship Match of 2022

Early in the week ending Oct 1, the weather was the main concern for everyone. Hurricane Ian was tearing across Florida and the path northward was not clear. Various weather-guessers had winds in the 20-25 mph and 2-3 inches of rain for the North Georgia area including the club location.

As Ian did it's thing and moved to the northeast-ish, the weather outlook for RBGC on Saturday Oct 1 was much improved. Saturday Oct 1 started with clear skies and lots of sun. Winds were a bit gusty in the morning, with them settling down for the afternoon.

10 competitors turned out for the final Light Rifle match of the 2022 season. The match included the awards of Club Champion and Club Junior Champion, along with the normal awards for placement.



After the safety briefing there was an approximate 15 minute sight-in period, competitors were called to the line for the first stage just after 9:30 under strong direct sunlight.

In the second stage, Xander Massengill with 177.00 led Beth Reynolds and Kirk Swanson by 1 shot and Simon Bailey by 2 shots.

The fourth stage is where the standings took a major shakeup. At the end of stage 4, leadership had changed to Kirk Swanson

leading by a respectable 14 points over Xander (366.01 / 352.01). Followed closely by Simon with 350.00 and Beth Reynolds at 347.03.

With stage 5 complete, scores were starting to spread out. Kirk still led Xander with an impressive 17 point difference (458.02 / 441.01). The race looked like a shoe-in for Kirk.

Stage 6 provided some more excitement as leader Kirk put an 85 on the target which opened the door for Xander to possibly pass Kirk. Fate was unkind to Xander also as he shot an 85 on the last target.


ZOMBIE XIV MATCH-October 15, 2022










The two Match Winner awards for Scope and Iron sights were handblown rifles made by Lillie Glassblowers in Smyrna, Ga.















Smallbore Rifle Prone Match

Our last match of the year was a Conventional 1200 for which we had five competitors, three shooting with a sling and two shooting F-Class. The wind was mild during the first match and then picked up, sometimes going through several complete reverses during the course of a single 20-shot string, and during the 100-yard stages the mirage made it difficult to see bullet holes in the targets.

In the sling division, Joseph Hall and Steve Hardin battled it out, with Joseph prevailing with a spectacular 1199-88X out of a possible 1200-120X. Steve finished close behind with an 1195-83X.

In F-Class, shooting on the difficult NRA Metric targets, Joe Ettershank didn't drop a single point during the first half of the day. In fact, in the first match of the day, he shot 400-39X, meaning he shot a perfect 200-20X on his first target and dropped just a

single X on his second one. He finished with an excellent 1194-92X, defeating Doug McNash who shot 1175-73X.

Bench Tech—Introduction

Before we get started, you need to know that due to our country's legal environment, your receipt of this article and any use you make of the information in this article are subject in every respect to the limitations and conditions language near the end of the article.

My name is Scott Fletcher. I have been a River Bend Gun Club (RBGC) member since 1998. I want to welcome you to "Bench Tech", a series of articles I am authoring on refined bench-reloading techniques for center-fire rifle ammunition and suggested techniques for shooting center-fire rifles from a bench. This article is an introduction to this series. It presents my motives for writing these articles, the objective of these articles, my qualifications to present these topics, tentative topics that will be presented, and expectations of what information these articles will present.....and what they won't.

My motives are simple. First, I want the articles to foster increased interest in the shooting sports, participation that ideally results in support at the ballot box. Second, I am at a stage in my life where I feel obligated to give back. I want to share information and techniques that I have learned so that RBGC club members can avoid my (sometimes epic) mistakes.

The objective of these articles is to show club members how they can produce targets as represented by pictures I-1, I-2, and I-3. Target I-1 is five shots obtained at 100 yards using hand loads crafted with mass-produced 52-grain, 22-caliber match

bullets fired from a factory rifle chambered in 22-250 Remington, shown in picture I-4. Target I-2 is three shots obtained at 200 yards using hand loads crafted with mass-produced 200-grain, 30-caliber hunting bullets fired from a custom hunting rifle chambered in 300 Winchester, shown in picture I-5. Target I-3 is three shots obtained at 200 yards using hand loads crafted with mass-produced 225-grain, .358-caliber hunting bullets fired from a custom hunting rifle chambered in 358 Winchester, shown in picture I-6.

All rifles were shot from benches at MP-1 using the rests shown in the pictures. All loads produced chamber pressures less than SAAMI specified maximums, as assessed by extractor groove measurements (a fancy, techno way of saying my

primer pockets are still tight after multiple firings). All rounds can and have been magazine-fed. The necks of the brass cases were not turned to a uniform thickness, nor were the primer pockets uniformed. No bullet sorting at all was done with the 52-grainers, and only sorting by bearing length was done for the 200- and 225-grainers. No esoteric bullet tipping was performed. Off-the-shelf resizing dies were used. Other generic tools and equipment used that were instrumental in the reloading process are laundry-listed in Chapter 23 of my eBook

found at africahunterquest.com. All the referenced items in Chapter 23 are available off-the-shelf.

The bullets used are shown in picture I-7, increasing in caliber, left to right. Note that all are BC challenged. I suspect some of you could run almost as fast as that dumpy, fat and ugly 225-grainer on the far right.



Also note that none of the rifles shown in the pictures can even remotely be considered as a Picture I-6

'bench gun'. All are switch-barrel hunting rifles (a total of six chamberings/fifteen different loads) that have taken critters. Both the front



and rear rests shown in the pictures were used to produce the referenced targets. With these rifles, a bipod front rest, the refined hand- loading procedures and bench-shooting techniques I will present, my hunting hand loads typically produce a three-shot group at 200 yards that is less than ¾ inch center to center, even for my 375 H&H and bullets up to 350 grains.

So, what are my qualifications for authoring these articles? Besides hand loading and shooting the ammunition that produced the previously referenced targets, I am a four-time 1000-yard benchrest Nationals Champion, and at one

time I held a six-target aggregate score record. I am also a gold-level, long-range shooter in matches sanctioned by the International Benchrest Shooters association.

Picture I-8 is one of my 1000-yard benchrest light gun, five-shot targets, (there is a double; can you find it?), and picture I-9 is one of my 1000-yard benchrest heavy gun, ten-shot targets. Both represent 'cannibal' hand loads where the impacts want to eat each other. For scale, the x-ring is 3 inches in diameter, and the 10-ring is 7 inches in diameter. All targets indicate that I am at least an adequate student of the ammunition-reloading craft; there are others whom I consider far better.

Refined hand-loading and bench-shooting techniques to achieve both conceptual and group-size objectives are primarily responsible for all the target results depicted....that, and keeping my evil oriental twin, Hu Flung Dung, away from the firing line. Such

concepts and techniques will be presented in future Bench Tech articles such as:

- The requirement to begin to begin
- Methods and equipment that enhance the prospect of good accuracy when shooting from a bench
- Fundamental center-fire rifle ammunition elements needed for good accuracy
- Resizing dies and their use in achieving good accuracy
- How to strategically prep new brass
- How to strategically prep fire-formed brass for subsequent reloading
- How to anneal brass
- How to strategically seat bullets
- Suggested bullet sorting techniques based on venue (only you can assess if such juice is worth the squeeze)
- How powder charge and seating depth variations affect accuracy
- How to indirectly measure to assess if your load has exceeded maximum pressure
- Load development strategies to find the accuracy inherent in your system
- Suggested 'best' use of a chronograph

Topics that will not be discussed are specific reloading recipes of powders and bullets, nor bullet tipping.

The first Bench Tech article will be a discussion of issues to enable getting your head wrapped around the thing I am calling 'accuracy'. The fundamental, absolute concept embedded in 'accuracy', no matter how you choose to define it, is the firearm never lies. I'm gonna say that again: the firearm never lies. Believing that absolute concept forces you to accept the three reasons responsible for the unexpected "stuff" that shows up on a target: a poor-quality rifle/system, poor-quality ammunition, or poor shooter skill. All are equally important in contributing to what shows up on the target. One or all could be responsible for the target "stuff". That is why the second article(s) will present techniques for shooting off of a bench. There is only problematic benefit of improved ammunition quality producing better target accuracy with your center-fire rifle if your bench technique resembles someone trying to wrestle a manatee. (Thanks, Spike)
