# **Update: Young Shooters Challenge 2021**

The annual Young Shooters Challenge (YSC 2021) is scheduled on Saturday, October 30, 2021 at River Bend Gun Club. As in previous years, when the club hosted YSC, this event will include seven separate shooting venues that will be held on Cowboy Hill. All firearms, ammunition and supporting materials will be provided by River Bend Gun Club and refreshments, beverages and lunch will also be provided for everyone in attendance. All young shooters will be coached by qualified RBGC club members to ensure the safety of participants and staff.

YSC 2021 is fully funded and supported by RBGC and there will be no charge to participants for this event. # Centerfire Plinking Range Plate Rack Destruction

River Bend Gun Club is the premier, top shelf gun club for Georgia. There is no finer equipped club with the depth and variety of ranges and sports venues than we have here. Our membership is as varied and enthusiastic as our club and members engage in participating, coaching and advocating every shooting sport in the safest possible environment out there, bar none.

So, it pains me to inform you that there are individuals for which rules do not seem to matter. Sometime between 2 July and 11 July, an individual or individuals broke Centerfire Plinking (CF PR) Range Rules by firing high energy rounds on Centerfire Plinking Range #2 plate rack, causing deep craters in each plate. After the plate rack was damaged, the CRO received several reports of shrapnel coming back and striking shooters, one, with sufficient force to draw blood. This is a shocking case of blatant vandalism. Now, club amenities are diminished and the safety of our ranges is called into question. This is contrary to the mission of our Club, contrary to the vision of our Board and Officers, contrary to the Member's devotion for safety and it is plain wrong that it happened at all.

While the investigation continues, I ardently encourage every member to be aware of each range's capabilities and its limitations as well. Signs are posted at each range. Each range sign-in box has a copy of the Range Rules earmarked for that particular range. If you have any doubt or question if your firearm is allowed on a range, flag down a patrolling ARCO, call the Manager's office or come by the Manager's office, especially if you believe there has been a mis-use of range equipment or you've witnessed mis-use of range equipment. The CRO and Club leadership want to know when these abuses take place so that appropriate steps are taken to learn the facts of the matter.

As members of the Club, each of us shoulder a responsibility to safeguard Club property, assets and the Club's reputation. A gentle word or suggestion will handle almost every issue that arises over which firearm is allowed on a particular range. When that friendly reminder is discarded, the task then falls to the CRO. Please bring this information to this office or the Club Manager for follow up as soon as possible.

With your help, we can River Bend's excellent safety record and uphold the Club's status as the state's premier outdoor shooting facility

### Official Club Business

#### Highlights of the June 14, 2021 Board of Directors Meeting

President Will Owensby presided over a quorum of eight Board members. Also attending were two club officers, the Club Manager, the Assistant Club Manager, and the Shotgun Hill Manager. The meeting was convened at 6:59PM on Monday, June 14, 2021. The meeting was held at RBGC's Gene Mowell Conference Center on club property.

A quorum was confirmed, the proposed agenda was amended and adopted, the minutes of the May 10, 2021 Board meeting were approved, and the following officer and manager reports were presented and accepted:

Board decisions made, actions taken, and items of interest:

- Ernie Knoche was nominated and unanimously approved as Vice President.
- The following Club Officers and Managers were nominated and unanimously approved:
  - Erica D'Amico as Club Secretary
  - Geoff Rhines as Treasurer
  - Bill Illg as Club Manager
  - Bill Wettingfeld as Shotgun Hill Manager
  - James Garner as Chief Range Officer
  - Phil Alexander as ACRO I
  - All currently approved ROs and AROs
- Larry Sollars, Life Member, and Randy Gamble, Annual Member were nominated and unanimously approved for Executive Committee.
- Art Thompson was nominated and unanimously approved for Facilities Committee Chair.
- Bill Illg was nominated and unanimously approved for Membership Committee Chair.
- James Garner was nominated and unanimously approved for Range Committee Chair.
- Pursuant to By-Laws Artic le XV (c), it was unanimously approved to extend committees until the end of the June 2022 Board Meeting.
- Bill Illg reported on behalf of Treasurer Geoff Rhines that May FYTD income was \$932K, an increase of approximately \$178K versus the same period in FY 2020.
- May FYTD expense was \$940K, an increase of approximately \$77K versus the same period in FY 2020.
- Cash in the bank as of 5/31/21 was \$343,310 including \$100,205 in Capital Reserve Fund.
- Club Secretary Erica D'Amico reported that the membership total at the beginning of the June 2021 meeting was 2,168, an increase of 183 members from the 1,985 active members in June 2020.
- The number of Senior Members in June 2021 was 194 (8.94% of RBGC membership).
- There are currently 20 members on the Life Membership Wait List.
- Assistant Club Manager Greg Hughes presented the CRO report and reported that 17 of 19 venues submitted Match Use Summary Reports for May. Total entries were 558 (210 members, 340 non-members, and 8 juniors). May match income was \$12,065 with \$1,937 reported to the club.
- Range Use Summary Report for May totaled 1,720 (1,502 members and 218 guests).
- There was a New Member Orientation (NMO) class held on May 23 for 36 attendees.
- There were 20 Tac Rifle Certifications in May.
- Club Manager Bill Illg reported that the HP tree removal project is almost completed.
- Galloway Construction and Consulting is waiting on their electrician and the metal for the roof to complete the Shotgun Hill renovation.
- The Cowboy Hill paving project has been completed.

- The soffit and roof shingles were replaced on the Shotgun Hill rest rooms.
- The high tower on Shotgun Hill was repaired with two new capacitors.
- The power pole on Cowboy Bay 3 has been repaired.
- New signs were purchased and installed on Shiloh Church Road.
- The Radio Shack has been painted.
- The dueling tree on Cowboy Bay 9 has been repaired.
- Four new plastic tables for the conference room have been purchased.
- A new 20" chainsaw was purchased for the maintenance crew.
- The Ad Hoc Reporting and Scheduler was purchased from Club Express and a utility program to update the Badge issued date field was purchased.
- The battery for the Cowboy Hill AED was replaced.
- Shotgun Hill Manager Bill Wettingfeld reported that shotgun range use in May was 443 shooters (408 members and 35 guests). 1,566 rounds were fired during the month with 29 cart rentals. Total May revenue to the club was \$9,753.
- The Board approved 27 new members and 1 reinstatement.
- Activities Committee Chairman Ederlin Owensby reported that the raffle drawing was held at the annual business meeting
  on May 16, 2021. Names were drawn for members who voted in person or assigned their vote via proxy for the 2021-2022
  club officer's election. Two RBGC annual membership certificates, six \$100 gift certificates, and twelve \$50 gift certificates
  were given away.
- Infrastructure Committee Chairman Bill Illg reported that the Silhouette Range cold range indicator lights are now running on 12v power to negate the effects of a power outage. This will provide 3 days of use during an outage. The Rimfire Rifle Range light conversion will take place this month.
- Membership Database and Renewal Automation Committee Chairman David Norcross requested that the old forum be
  discontinued. The request was approved unanimously, and the old data will be removed by July 1, 2021 (the AED usage
  information will be moved over to new forum).
- Public Relations Committee Chairman David Norcross reported that the June Bullet-IN reached 2,115 recipients. Open rate was 62% and 47% of members clicked through the newsletter.
- Temporary Range Rules Revision Committee Chairman Charlie Iracondo presented the finalized proposed rule changes. Changes were approved unanimously and will be included in the revised range rule book effective 6/14/21.
- Scholarship Committee Ernie Knoche reported that the committee will continue selling the remaining raffle tickets for a Glock at \$10 each at the Action Pistol match to raise funds for the Scholarship fund.
- The Scholarship Committee has received \$7,551 in donations so far from renewals.
- Will Owensby reported that the go live date on the website for Young Shooters Challenge registration is August 1, 2021.

Regular monthly Board meetings are called to order at 7:00 PM on the second Monday of each month in the Gene Mowell Conference Center. RBGC members and families are cordially invited to attend.

# July 2021 NRA Light Rifle Match Report - State Championship Match

Unusually cool comfortable July weather greeted the 12 competitors on hand for the 2021 Light Rifle Standing Championship match. Skies were clear, humidity low and a very gentle breeze kept conditions very comfortable without influencing the shooting stance. Attendees were greeted to the range by a helium filled American Flag and a Happy Birthday balloon (more on that later).

Range officer Don Coleman was in attendance to run the match with Match Director Simon Bailey, taking a non-competitive role to serve in the scoring role and as support for birthday girl Fran Bailey who assisted in scoring and performed Stat office duties.

The July match is the Light Rifle Standing State Championship match and is traditionally an 80 shot engagement fired at 50 feet. After a brief sightin period, the match got underway just before 10:00 AM.

With a large Marksman class but the other classes under-represented, voluntary class promotion allowed for both a Marksman and a Master class to be formed, membership perhaps foreshadowing the final match outcome.

The first stage results were not unpredictable with Kirk Swanson (promoted to Master) and George Wilson (promoted to Master) tied for first at 90.1X and Sub-Junior Marksman Xander Massengill filling out the leaderboard with an 88-1X. Stage two is where the unpredictable started with Wilson posting an unusually low stage score (for him) of 81.0 by virtue of a missed bull and associated 10 point loss to drop from the leader group.

Swanson fired a 92.0 to take over first place while a

very consistent Bob Morris moved to 2nd on a 91.0. Xander's dad, David Massengill, took over 3rd place on a pair of 86.0's with Xander slipping to 3rd Marksman behind Chris Sagar (1st Marksman 171.0) and Don Coleman (2nd Marksman 168.1)

The next two stages saw Morris return to form posting a 93.1 and a 92.0 to take over 1st place after 4 stages posting a 361.1 aggregate. The 4th stage saw Swanson spot the field an additional 10 points with his miss for the day to drop to 2nd overall at 354.1. Wilson, recovering from his 10 point spot, scored low 90's to hold 3rd with a 352.2. A pair of 87.0s saw Coleman move into 1st Marksman by X count over D. Massengill 342.1X to 342.0X.



At the end of 6, Coleman and D. Massengill swapped places with David leading Coleman by a point at 513.0 while Xander Massengill held 3rd Marksman. Also notable was Angelina Lemley's effort with her stage scores jumping into the 80's, a solid improvement.

The top three positions remained unchanged, with Wilson moving one point closer to Swanson (535-2X to 536-2X). All top three shooters were now posting low to mid-90's but Morris's consistency and refusal to give up his 10 points, kept him ahead.

The final two stages had Wilson finish out with a 90.2 and a 91.0 to finish 3rd overall at 716.4X. Swanson finished the match very well putting a final stage score and match high 96.2X to move within 3 points of Morris who continued his very consistent performance to finish as Match Winner and State Champion with a 714-3X over Swanson's 721-6X.

The next match is August 14th on the Action Pistol Bays. Come on out and see what the Match Director has to challenge your revolver. The entry fee is only \$15 (\$5 for 2nd gun). You do not have to be a member of either ICORE or River Bend to participate. Meet at Action Pistol Ranges, with; setup at 7am, if you'd like to help, registration opens at 8am, a short shooters meeting at 9am, and then hammer down. First time shooters will need to meet up prior to the match for a safety briefing.

As a chapter of the International Confederation of Revolver Enthusiasts, ICORE, we serve to promote enjoyment and satisfaction in action shooting competition with revolvers. We're about safety and having fun while improving our shooting skills.

ICORE combines elements of the other pistol shooting disciplines into a fun competition exclusively for revolvers. Scoring is based on time with extra seconds added or subtracted depending on the accuracy of the hits. Steel plates as well as other reactive targets are also used in ICORE events. For more info got to <a href="RBGC.ORG">RBGC.ORG</a> and look under Shooting Venues – Action Shooting Sports.

Caliber wise, anything from .32 up with .38spl, 9mm and .45ACP being the most common. No magnum, or +P+ calibers for safety reasons. Rimfire shooters are welcome, but will be scored separately. (Because of the steel targets no magnum, hollow point, steel core or hyper velocity rounds. Only lead, coated lead, jacketed or plated bullets, please.)

We have an active Facebook page under "Georgia ICORE" and use PractiScore for registration and for posting scores. On-site registration is of course welcome. So grab your gun, holster, ammo, speedloaders & holders, and eye & ear protection and join us for a great time.
