Young Shooters Challenge 2021

River Bend Gun Club hosted the 18th annual young shooters Challenge on Cowboy Hill on Saturday, October 30, 2021. The club sponsors the annual YSC event to introduce local youth to the shooting sports and to demonstrate the club's appreciation for the community. YSC is open to the public and all guns, ammunition, targets, supplies, lunch and beverages are provided by the club at no charge. Like so many things that were canceled or put on hold due to the Coronavirus COVID 19 pandemic, the YSC event for 2020 was also canceled.

Although rain was forecast on the day of the event, it rained only a little in the early morning before everyone arrived and late in the afternoon after the event concluded and all young shooters had departed. It was cold and cloudy but everyone was dressed for the weather and the food service volunteers had plenty of hot coffee for the adults and hot coco for the young shooters. At the club, the ambient temperature remained between 52 to 58 degrees with an intermittent, light breeze.

80 of the 120 young shooters who pre-registered for YSC 2021 attended the event and thoroughly enjoyed themselves while participating in seven, carefully supervised shooting venues. This level of participation on a late fall, October day with rain forecast shows how much the parents and young shooters appreciated the fact that RBGC hosts the event and how determined they were to participate. 54 RBGC members volunteered to be on site from 7:30 AM to 3:00 PM to handle the many tasks necessary to run the event.



Young shooters who pre-registered on the RBGC website for YSC 2021 were placed into one of three, age related categories. 8-10, 11-14, and 15-18 were the three age groups with 8 years of age being the minimum age to participate and 18 years of age as the maximum participation age. There were no separate categories for gender and young men and women in the same age group competed equally on a level playing field.

- .22 Rimfire Rifle Prone on CB Hill bay 7, run by Doug McNash
- .30 Caliber, M1 Carbine on CB Hill bay 8, run by Tim Noble
- .22 Rimfire Pistol on CB Hill bay 9, run by Mike Currier
- .22 Rimfire Rifle Benchrest on CB Hill bay 10 run by Simon Bailey
- .410 Gauge Shotgun Trap on the edge of the CB Hill parking lot, run by Mario Quattlebaum

While the main mission of the YSC event is to introduce local youth to the shooting sports in a safe, fun environment, the event is also a shooting competition. The scores for the seven shooting events were totaled to determine the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners in each of the three age groups. The competition was fierce and the winning scores were very close. The young ladies shooting in all age groups were very competitive and gave no quarter to the young men. Even though the competition was intense, all of the young shooters conducted themselves in a manner their parents could be proud of and they all appeared to enjoy themselves immensely.

Life Memberships are Available

River Bend Gun Club has 194 Life Members. Life Members are club members who purchased a Life Membership from the club or who inherited one from a parent or relative. Life Members pay no annual dues, they elect the Club President and they elect the three Life Directors who sit on the Board of Directors alongside the three Annual Directors, the Past President, the Vice President and the Club President.

The purchase of a Life Membership is an investment in River Bend Gun Club. Life Membership certificates held by club members may be redeemed at any time the member wishes to sell the certificate back to the club.

Pursuant to the River Bend Gun Club, Inc. By-Laws, Article V-Transfer of Life Memberships, Life Membership certificates may be transferred or sold. The club has the first right of refusal for the purchase of Life Memberships and is currently paying \$7,000 for Life Memberships. Life Membership certificates purchased by the club are offered to the first club member on the Life Membership Waiting List for \$7,500. If the member to whom the Life Membership is offered refuses, that member is dropped from the waiting list and the Life Membership is offered to the second person on the list.

Seven Life Memberships have been sold since January 2021. Earlier in the year, there were 22 club members on the Life Membership Waiting List. Seven of those members purchased one of the Life Memberships offered and are now Life Members, seven of the members on the list declined to purchase the Life Membership offered and were dropped from the list and, eight club members currently remain on the list. Any club member may be placed on the Life Membership Waiting List by submitting the application form to the Club Manager or Club Secretary. The Life Membership Waiting List Application form is available in the Documents section of the club website.

Club Manager Needed

River Bend Gun Club is seeking a Club Manager to assume management of daily club operations within the next six months. Bill Illg, our current Club Manager since May 2018 has done and continues to do an outstanding job. Mr. Illg plans to retire in May 2022 and the Board of Directors and I are beginning the search for a Club Manager to succeed Mr. Illg now.

The Club Manager plays a key role in overseeing the daily operation of the club and they also are serve as an equal member of the Club Management Team that is comprised of the Club President, the Club Manager and the CRO. The Board of Directors is also an integral part of Club Management and the Board is the ultimate authority for the management and allocation of the club's financial resources. While the Board of Directors meets monthly, the Club President, Club Manager and CRO are the most active members of the Club Management Team, they meet weekly and communicate almost daily.

Pursuant to the River Bend Gun Club, Inc. By-Laws, Article XI – Powers of the Board of Directors, Section G.

"The Board may create the position of manager, and such assistant managers as it may deem necessary for the proper and successful operation of the Club, and shall determine their duties, responsibilities and compensation. Such manager shall, subject to the overall supervision of the Board, have general responsibility for the operation, maintenance, preservation, and supervision of all Club operations and improvements excepting shooting activities and duties and responsibilities otherwise allocated or assigned in the By-Laws. He shall have authority to employ such persons or entities on a full- or part-time basis as may be required to accomplish Club operations, their duties, authority, and the compensation to be paid therefor. He shall have authority to enter into contracts and incur bills up to a limit determined by the Board annually, but shall be required to secure approval of the Board or Executive Committee for expenditures in excess of such amount. He shall make a monthly report to the Board of all his activities, Club properties, income and expenditures, and shall be subject to the supervision and

direction of the Board. He shall have no authority over any officers as created under these By-Laws, but shall provide assistance to such officers and shall be responsible for performance of such maintenance of the various ranges as the range officers and Range Committee may request. Assistant managers shall be charged with the same responsibilities, but shall have no authority except such as the Board shall specifically approve. [Amended 10-08-2012]"

In addition to managing the daily operations of the club and supervision of multiple direct reports, the Club Manager also serves as Chairman of the Membership Committee and as Chairman of the Infrastructure Committee.

The Club Manager position at River Bend Gun Club is a full-time, salaried position requiring a minimum of 40 hours weekly and requiring the Club Manager to be on site at the club at least one weekend monthly. Bill Illg is a talented manager and his dedication to the club is beyond question. It is imperative that the club finds a well-qualified club member who is equally dedicated and who is highly motivated to serve as Club Manager. This is why we are beginning the search for a Club Manager early. Ideally, we seek to hire a highly qualified candidate early so that this person will be able to work with Mr. Illg and with Greg Hughes, Assistant Club Manager learning the job for a reasonable period prior to Mr. Illg's retirement.

Minimum qualifications for the RBGC Club Manager position follow:

- Must be an RBGC member in good standing for at least three years
- Must have prior experience managing multiple direct reports
- Must be proficient in Microsoft Word, Excel, Power Point and computer-based data management, accounting and communication systems
- Must possess excellent organizational skills and be results oriented
- Must possess well developed inter personal skills and public speaking ability
- Must possess well rounded management skills that allow independent decision making and also enable them to work effectively as a member of a team
- Must provide a detailed resume of employment, education and firearms related experience and training

River Bend Gun Club is one of the best gun clubs in the country, it is a wonderful place for members, their families and friends to pursue the shooting sports, compete, socialize and enjoy the natural, North GA woodland habitat. In order to help maintain the club's high standards, we need the right person for the Club Manager position.

Scholarship Program

The Holidays are here and the deadline for submitting applications for the 2022 River Bend Gun Club Scholarships is approaching quickly. **All applications must be emailed before midnight, December 31, 2021.**

Scholarship applicants can <u>click here to download</u> the application; necessary instructions are included within the application. The River Bend Gun Club Scholarship Program 2022 information can also be located on our website under *About Us.*

Applicants are encouraged to submit their applications as soon as possible. Those who wait until the last minute may not have enough time to correct any deficiencies by the deadline. An Applicant is disqualified for incomplete submittals received by the deadline or not following instructions; in most cases this entails failure to provide two reference letters. Extensions beyond the deadline will not be granted for any reason.

After the application has been accepted, an in-person interview with the Scholarship Committee will be scheduled in the upcoming months. **Applicants should prepare for the committee interview the same way they would prepare for an employment interview.** Dress the way you want to be perceived; typically, business casual. Take time to study the program and become familiar with the criteria and method of selection; be prepared:

The ideal candidate possesses the aptitudes, demeanor and motivation to successfully enter and complete a university or an accredited professional school program. The ideal scholarship candidate knows and can support the Second Amendment of the Bill of Rights and will represent the shooting sports in a positive manner.

In years past, the Scholarship Committee has awarded scholarships to successful and deserving candidates. They each demonstrated the necessary scholastic aptitudes, instructional comprehension, forethought, preparedness and initiative.

Official Club Business

Highlights of the October 11, 2021 Board of Directors Meeting

President Will Owensby presided over a quorum of seven Board members. Also attending were four club officers, the Club Manager, and the Assistant Club Manager. The meeting was convened at 7:00PM on Monday, October 11, 2021. The meeting was held at RBGC's Gene Mowell Conference Center on club property.

A quorum was confirmed, the proposed agenda was adopted, the minutes of the September 13, 2021, Board meeting were approved, and the following officer and manager reports were presented and accepted:

Treasurer Secretary Chief Range Officer Club Manager Shotgun Manager

Board decisions made, actions taken, and items of interest:

- Treasurer Geoff Rhines reported that September FYTD income was \$657K, an increase of approximately \$29K versus the same period in FY 2020.
- September FYTD expense was \$223K, a decrease of approximately \$24K versus the same period in FY 2020.
- Cash in the bank as of 9/30/21 was \$553,543 including \$100,209 in Capital Reserve Fund.
- Club Secretary Erica D'Amico reported that the membership total at the beginning of the October 2021 meeting was 2,124.
- The number of Senior Members in October 2021 was 188 (8.9% of RBGC membership).
- There are currently 20 members on the Life Membership Wait List.
- Chief Range Officer Jim Garner reported that 17 of 20 venues submitted Match Use Summary Reports for September. Total entries were 672 (231 members, 366 non-members, and 75 juniors). September match income was \$40,575 with \$2,360.28 reported to the club.
- Range Use Summary Report for September totaled 1,762 (1,470 members and 292 guests).
- There was a New Member Orientation (NMO) class held on September 26 for 25 of the 25 registered attendees.
- There were 6 Tac Rifle Certifications, 1 NFA Certification, and 1 Supergun Certification in September.
- The board approved Simon Bailey as ARO for NRA Light Rifle.
- The board approved Chris Sagar as RO for NRA Light Rifle.
- The board approved Simon Bailey as ARO for Smallbore Prone Match.
- The board approved \$3,388.67 for the following 3-Gun equipment:
 - ♦ 5 Commander shot timers with green cover at \$158.00 each
 - ♦ 5 42" Pepper Popper, 3/8" AR 550 with base at \$288.97 each
 - ♦ 5 28" Pepper Popper, 3/8" AR 500 with base at \$228.97 each
- Club Manager Bill Illg reported that the two Centerfire Plinking Bays have been graded and covered with crush and run.
- The High Power shed has been delivered and has been connected to A/C power.
- The floor of the Shotgun Hill clubhouse is almost completely installed.
- AED pads were received and replaced in 5 locations.
- A new computer for Shotgun Hill was purchased.
- Three heavy duty rockers were ordered for the trap range.
- A BBQ Grill was purchased.
- Shotgun Hill Manager Bill Wettingfeld reported that shotgun range use in September was 421 shooters (355 members and 66 guests). 1,284 rounds were fired during the month with 21 cart rentals. Total September revenue to the club was \$8,042.
- The Board approved 18 new members and 1 reinstatement.
- Public Relations Committee Chairman David Norcross reported that the October Bullet-IN reached 2,167 recipients. Open rate was 1,235 (58%) and 685 (55%) of members clicked through the newsletter.

Regular monthly Board meetings are called to order at 7:00 PM on the second Monday of each month in the Gene Mowell Conference Center. RBGC members and families are cordially invited to attend.

2021 SE REGIONAL .22/ Black Powder Cartridge Rifle Match

This year's SE Regional .22/ BPCR match was held Oct 21-24th with first 2 days on the High Power range and 2 days on the Silhouette range. A special Thanks to the Board and Club Managers for arranging to have the driveway and area behind the Silhouette shooting facility paved just in time before our match was to begin! That was really appreciated by all of our 29 participants and other guests from 11 states that were here to enjoy the 4 day match. We gathered Thursday morning on the 200 yd berm for our .22 match with 2 relays x 15 rds each at reduced targets - 200 & 600 yds. But before we could start, we had our first of 4 rain delays where we had to cover up equipment and mats... but managed to complete the 2 relays by that afternoon. River Bend's own Gerald Parks was the .22 Match Winner-Scope with a score of 298 (out of a possible 300) /11x's. A local junior shooter, Melanie Krone won 3rd place-Scope and Hi Junior with a 295/8x's. Tom Klinger, from Fla, was MW- Irons with a 291/11x's.





Friday gave us beautiful weather as we shot 2 relays X 10 rds each at 600yd targets. The wind always makes it interesting from the 600 yd berm and this day was no different. Clarence Dykstra, from Tx, was the Match Winner with a score of 181/0x's out of a possible 200. 2nd Open was Charlie Schroeder also from Tx with a 180/5x's and 3rd Open was RBGC member - Steve Hubbard with a 178/3x's. Steve and Ken Wienken had the same score so they had a 5 shot shoot off that Steve won making Ken 1stExpert.

Our 2 day aggregate Silhouette Match was on Saturday and Sunday with great weather on both days. The

A bonus stage from the 2021 International Revolver Championship was the XXX target configuration. FIFTEEN TARGETS. Only the A & B areas counted. And those black areas? That's not hard cover. Those are No-Shoot zones. Slow and accurate shooting recommended here.

The day was concluded with two classifiers, Side by Side and Field Standard. There were plenty of strong hand and weak hand requirements to test any shooter's mettle.

ICORE combines elements of the other pistol shooting disciplines into a fun competition exclusively for revolvers. Scoring is based on time with extra seconds added **or subtracted** depending on the accuracy of the hits. Steel plates as well as other reactive targets are also used in ICORE events. Caliber wise, anything from .32 up with .38spl, 9mm and .45ACP being the most common. .22lr Rimfire shooters are welcome, but will be scored separately. Because of the steel targets no magnum, P+ calibers, hollow point, steel core or hyper velocity rounds. Only lead, coated lead, jacketed or plated bullets.


